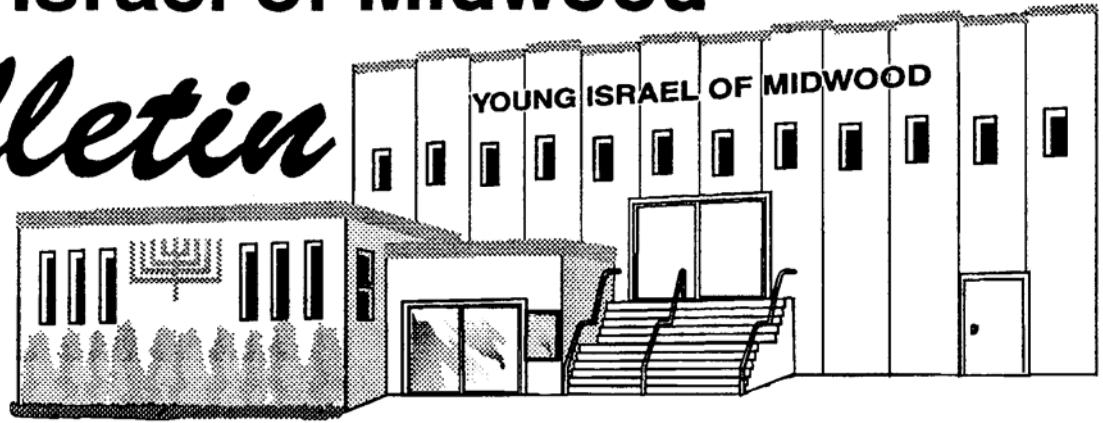

FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Dear fellow mispallel,

Jews have always regarded chametz on Pesach with particular horror. Indeed, the halacha itself treats chametz with special severity. Not only may chametz not be eaten – no benefit, even, may be derived from it. (Thus, one may not even savor the smell of chametz as one passes a non-Jewish bakery on Pesach.) And the most negligible amount of chametz renders forbidden even a large quantity of food into which it falls.

What is it about chametz that requires us to deal with it so severely?

The answer, I would suggest, is that chametz is volatile. By definition, it is in ferment, and, therefore, contagious. We don't think much of pork, but a piece of pork, at least, doesn't reach out and try to convert other pieces of meat to pork-ness. A tiny bit of raw chametz, on the other hand, has the power to ferment an entire vat of dough.

No compromise can be made with contagion.


Our rabbis saw chametz as a metaphor for the yetzer hora, the evil inclination within man. The yetzer hora is also in ferment, always seeking to grow. It is a truism that man was created part angel, and part beast; but our rabbis stressed that the relationship between those two parts is not static. If the beast is not fought, it grows and overwhelms “the better angels of our nature”; and a society that winks at vice eventually chokes on corruption.

Pesach is the holiday of our freedom. But the Torah teaches us that before we can celebrate our freedom we have to restrain those forces within ourselves that would ferment freedom into abandon, and liberty into license. That is surely a timely message, today as always.

Dangerous Haven: Polish Jewish Refugees in the Soviet Union

In 1940, after Jews in areas of Soviet-occupied Poland refused to take Soviet citizenship, Stalin ordered their deportation to forced labor in the interior of the Soviet Union. When Germany invaded the Soviet Union in June, 1941, some Jews fled east, and others joined the Soviet withdrawal from advancing Nazi forces. Although conditions in the Soviet Union were very difficult, deportation proved to be life-saving for most. The documentary film, **Saved by Deportation**, follows the story of the Scharfs, from Poland to Siberia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan, on their odyssey of survival. Dramatic readings will illustrate personal experiences of others who followed a similar path.

The program is free and open to the public.
